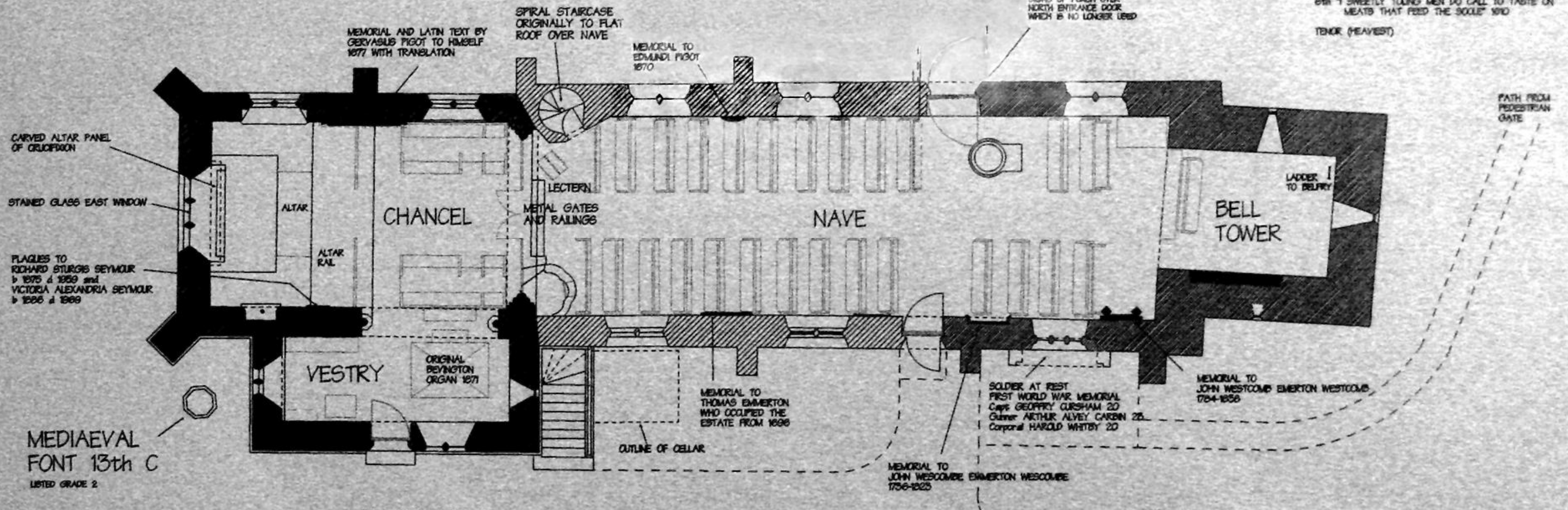

- 1st BY PUBLIC DONATION 1866 ENCORDED FROM GENEROUS HEARTS AND DILIGENT HANDS LAUS DEO
 - 2nd ALL SAINTS DAY 1871 "GLORIA IN EXCELSIS DEO"
 - 3rd EDONNO GERVASE PILOT 1833
 - 4th DITTO "GOD SAVE THE CHURCH" 1833
 - 5th "DUM MICHAEL TONAT Q3 NOS AD HOSTE CEFELLAT" DATES FROM THE LAST HALF OF THE 15th CENTURY ABOUT THE TIME OF ELIZABETH 1ST THIS COULD BE ONE OF THE BELLS RECORDED IN 1502 HENRY 2ND
 - 6th "SWEETLY TOUNG MEN DO CALL TO TASTE ON MEATS THAT FEED THE SOULE" 1510
