The king has granted to William, parson of the **church** of Kirkby in Ashfield, and Robert Russel, his brother, that he may render 5 m. at the Exchequer of Michaelmas in the thirty-fifth year of the 10 m. which are owed to him of the fine of 15 m. that they made with him before G. de Langley and his associates, justices itinerating to take the pleas of the forest in **Nottinghamshire**, for trespass of the forest, and the other 5 m. at the Exchequer of Easter next following. Order to the barons of the Exchequer to cause this to be done and enrolled thus.*


