Captain Harold Bass MC – 10th Battalion attached to 2nd West Yorks.

Harold Bass joined the 10th battalion in October of 1915 just after the battalion came out of the Battle of Loos. He served in the Armentieres sector through until the spring of 1916 when the battalion moved down to prepare for the Somme offensive. Captain Bass saw action just to the north of Fricourt on July 1st 1916, the opening day of the Somme. He fought at Arras and at Passchendaele in 1917 where he was adjutant to the 10th battalion. In February of 1918 the battalion was disbanded and

Captain Bass was attached to the 2nd battalion of the West Yorks. Captain Harold Bass was killed in action with the West Yorks at the "Action of Villers Bretonneux" on April 24th 1918. His body lost to the battlefield, his name is remembered today on the Pozieres Memorial on the old Somme battlefield just off the Albert to Bapaume road.
